SUMMARY OF TOTAL LOSSES DURING 1977

Summary. The total tonnage lost by the world fleet during 1977 (1,073,127 tons gross), was 82,982 tons less than during 1976 and is the second highest figure ever recorded. The number of ships lost (336) was nine less than the previous year. Tonnage lost in the burnt category increased substantially and included the ore/oil carrier "Siljestad" of 83,561 tons gross, the largest ship lost during the year. Small increases were recorded in the foundered and collision categories whilst tonnage wrecked decreased by almost half from the previous year's record figure.

Foundered. The number of ships (129) which foundered during 1977 was eighteen more than the previous year. Over one-third of these vessels were over twenty years old. An increase of 32,265 tons gross in tonnage lost was recorded.

The largest ship lost was the Liberian tanker "IRENES CHALLENGE" of 21,069 tons gross, built in 1956.

Missing. Tonnage in this category totalled 7,969 tons gross during the year and included the Cypriot cargo ship "EUROBULKER" of 7,311 tons gross, which was last heard of in the Indian Ocean.

Burnt. Tonnage totally lost through fire during 1977 increased by 248,055 tons gross to 477,409 tons gross which is the highest figure ever recorded, being 145,902 tons gross more than the previous record figure of 331,507 tons gross recorded in 1973. Fifty-seven ships were lost during the year, three less than in 1976. Five tankers over 10,000 tons gross were lost and included the Liberian tanker "Universe Defiance" of 51,319 tons gross, built in 1958. Two combination carriers were lost, one of which being the Norwegian ore/oil carrier "Siljestad" of 83,561 tons gross, built in 1970.

Total losses through fire during 1977 included fifteen ships which were in port.

Also in this category was the Norwegian wooden motor sealer "Is-OLA" of 171 tons gross, built in 1906, the oldest ship totally lost during the year.

Collision. Tonnage lost through collision increased by 4,816 tons gross from the previous year's figure, to a total of 58,041 tons gross. Thirty-two ships were lost during the year, the same number as in 1976.

The largest ship lost was the Panamanian tanker "Oswego Tarmac" of 10,535 tons gross, built in 1944.

At least eight of the vessels were involved in collision in bad visibility or fog.

Wrecked. Tonnage lost through stranding or striking rocks, sunken wrecks, etc., during 1977 fell by 273,637 tons gross from the previous year's record figure to a total of 327,360 tons gross. The number of ships lost (112) fell by twenty.

The largest ship wrecked was the British tanker "Texaco Brisbane" of 31,118 tons gross, built in 1961.

Lost. Under this heading are included total losses which for want of sufficient information, or for other reasons, cannot be classified. The 1977 figure comprises three ships of 4,924 tons gross.

Distribution. The geographical distribution of the total losses during the year is shown in map form on pages 72 to 75.

Types. The total number of 336 ships lost during 1977 included 19 oil tankers totalling 372,550 tons gross (35 per cent), 10 bulk carriers totalling 235,441 tons gross (22 per cent) and 82 fishing craft. One hundred and ninety-four general cargo ships were lost. Thirty-one ships were known to be in ballast.

Fifty-three per cent of the ships lost were under 500 tons gross. The number of ships lost over 10,000 tons gross was twenty-three.

Over seven per cent of all ships lost were less than five years old; 29 per cent were over twenty-five years of age.

Total losses to the following countries, whose merchant fleets total more than six million tons gross, are shown as Registration.

Panama suffered the highest number of ships lost (54), whilst Liberia suffered the most tonnage (291,626 tons gross) lost.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

Tonnage broken up during 1977 fell by 521,580 tons gross from the previous year's record figure to 6,093,071 tons gross, which is the second highest figure ever recorded. The number of ships involved (914) was 180 more than during 1976 and is the highest number recorded since 1972.

Owing to continued depressed conditions in the shipping industry, there is no shortage of tonnage available for demolition. The slight fall in tonnage broken up in 1977 is merely a reflection of a reduced demand for scrap steel with a resultant fall in ship scrap prices.

Tanker tonnage disposed of (4,417,891 tons gross) amounted to nearly 73 per cent of the total tonnage sold for demolition. The average size of tanker broken up was 13,763 tons gross.

Four hundred and seven general cargo ships were broken up, an increase of 199 over the previous year's figure. Over 41 per cent of these ships were over twenty years old.

Countries sending most tonnage to the breakers were Liberia (2,223,355 tons gross), Panama (861,264 tons gross), Japan (552,002 tons gross), Greece (477,728 tons gross), United Kingdom (309,794 tons gross) and Italy (264,705 tons gross).

Seventy per cent of all tonnage broken up went to the Province of Taiwan and to Spain. Increased shares went to Pakistan and Italy.
