Notes for the Current Quarter

CASUALTIES

The percentage proportion of the world fleet totally lost during the March Quarter, 1982, was 0.10% of ships and 0.06% of tonnage (see Table 1).

Among the total losses reported this quarter:

The two oldest ships were the tanker POLING BROS. No. 9 (USA) 1 242 GT, built 1934, which sank after fire and explosion and the passenger/ferry SAMAA DHAAN (MDV) 2 149 GT, built 1934, which was broken up following fire damage (see page 8).

The largest ship was the tanker GOLDEN DOLPHIN (USA) 44 881 GT, built 1974, which sank after explosion and fire in tanks (see page 7).

The highest loss of life occurred in the general dry cargo ship PULAU SATONDA (IDA) 310 GT, built 1950, which was reported missing after sailing from Surabaya with a crew of 17 and 30 deck-passengers (see page 7).

A notable loss during the quarter was the tanker VICTORY (GRC) 12 487 GT, built 1960, which broke in two in heavy weather in the Atlantic Ocean. The forepart sank quickly but the stern section, a hazard to navigation, had to be scuttled. Fifteen lives were lost (see page 7).

Serious casualties were reported to the following ships over 10 000 GT during the quarter, which are not included in this F (see definition of Total Loss).

BARAUNI (IND) 45 752 GT, built 1970. Damaged by fire 18 March, reported repaired.

HUANDOY (PER) 18 723 GT, built 1965. Damaged by stranding 18 March, reported repaired.

LOUIS S. ST-LAURENT (CAN) 10 908 GT, built 1969. Damaged by explosion and fire 6 March, reported repaired.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

The proportion of the fleet broken up, etc., not consequent upon casualty was 0.35% of ships and 0.52% of tonnage (see Table 1).

The volume of tonnage broken up, etc., this quarter, compared with the same period last year, showed an increase of 1 050 115 gross tonnage. Disposals from the Liberian fleet rose from 244 519 GT in March, 1981, to a current figure of 849 354 GT.

The oldest ship reported broken up this quarter was the suction dredger/sand carrier SEASTONE (GB) 861 GT, built 1907 (see page 19).

Casualty Information System

All data in this Casualty Return is produced from the Casualty Information System maintained on the Society's IBM 3033N mainframe computer. Further details of the Casualty Information System and other shipping information files may be found on the inside back cover of this Return.

Definitions

- 1 **TOTAL LOSS** For the purpose of Lloyd's Register Casualty Returns the term 'Total Loss' refers to a merchant ship which, as a result of being a marine casualty, has ceased to exist, either by virtue of the fact that the ship is irrecoverable or has subsequently been broken up. Ships which have been declared constructive total losses but which are undergoing or have undergone repairs during the quarter are not included in the Return.
- 2 **CASUALTY CATEGORIES** are defined as follows:
 - 1 **Foundered** Includes ships which sank as a result of heavy weather, springing of leaks, breaking in two, etc., and not as a consequence of categories 2-7.
 - 2 **Missing** After a reasonable period of time, no news having been received of a ship and its fate being therefore

undetermined, the ship is posted as 'Missing' at the Corporation of Lloyd's and is included in the Missing category on the data base together with similar cases reported by other reliable sources.

Note: In peacetime, missing ships are considered as losses occasioned to ships by marine perils.

3 Fire/Explosion Includes ships lost as a result of fire and/or explosion where it is the first event reported.

Note: It therefore follows that casualties involving fires and/or explosions after collisions, stranding, etc., would be categorised under 'Collision', 'Stranding'.

4 Collision Includes ships lost as a result of striking or being struck by another ship, regardless of whether under way, anchored or moored. This category does not include striking underwater wrecks.

5 Contact Includes ships lost as a result of striking an external substance but not another ship or the sea bottom (see categories 4 & 6). This category includes striking drilling rigs, platforms, regardless of whether in fixed position or in tow.

6 Wrecked/Stranded Includes ships lost as a result of touching the sea bottom, sandbanks or seashore, etc., as well as entanglement on underwater wrecks.

7 War Loss—Damage During Hostilities This category is intended to encompass loss occasioned to ships by hostile acts.

8 Hull/Machinery Damage Includes ships lost as a result of hull/machinery damage or failure which is not attributable to categories 1-7 or category 9.

9 Miscellaneous Includes ships which have been lost which, for want of sufficient reasons, cannot be classified.

The last three categories are included together under the heading 'Lost' in Table 1.

- 3 **DATE OF CASUALTY** The date of casualty is that on which the first reported event of the casualty occurred.

Notes for the Current Quarter

CASUALTIES

The percentage proportion of the world fleet totally lost during the June Quarter, 1982, was 0.11% of ships and 0.07% of tonnage (see Table 1).

The quarter's figures were dominated by the high tonnage in the 'Lost, etc.' category (154 885 gross tonnage) of which 143 016 GT was lost during hostilities. The tanker HERCULES (LIB) built 1971, bombed during the South Atlantic conflict, contributed 99 827 GT to this figure and was the largest ship totally lost during the quarter (see page 38). It may be worth noting that, as a result, the total tonnage lost due to hostilities in the quarter is greater than that in any complete year since 1945.

Among the total losses reported this quarter:

The oldest ship was the general dry cargo ship KRUNGKAO (THA) 159 GT, built 1922, which sank in heavy weather (see page 34).

The highest loss of life occurred in the ferry QUEEN HELEN (PHL) 497 GT, date of build unknown. Thirty-seven people were reported killed and twelve were reported missing after she sustained an explosion and fire in the Sulu Sea (see page 36).

Serious casualties were reported to the following ships over 10 000 GT during the quarter, which are not included in this Return (see definition of Total Loss).

MANAMARIA (T) (GRC) 13 071 GT, built 1965. Damaged by fire 8 June, reported laid up.

MERCURY (SNG) 11 203 GT, built 1960. Damaged by fire 10 June, reported laid up.

NOOR BA (T) (SAU) 16 491 GT, built 1960. Contact with submerged object 20 May; reported repairs in hand.

OGDEN WILLAMETTE (T) (USA) 20 884 GT, built 1969. Engine room flooded 16 June, reported repairs in hand.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

The proportion of the fleet broken up, etc., not consequent upon casualty was 0.34% of ships and 0.93% of tonnage (see Table 1).

The volume of tonnage broken up, etc., was the highest ever recorded for a single quarter. It was 1 843 040 gross tonnage higher than that recorded for the same period last year, figures for Panama, Greece and Liberia showing a marked increase.

The largest ship reported broken up this quarter was the tanker JALINGA (NOR) 128 251 GT, built 1970 (see page 44).

The oldest ship reported broken up this quarter was the ferry KEIHAN MARU (JPN) 342 GT, built 1928 (see page 45).

Note: In peacetime, missing ships are considered as losses occasioned to ships by marine perils.

3 Fire/Explosion Includes ships lost as a result of fire and/or explosion where it is the first event reported.

Note: It therefore follows that casualties involving fires and/or explosions after collisions, stranding, etc., would be categorised under 'Collision', 'Stranding'.

4 Collision Includes ships lost as a result of striking or being struck by another ship, regardless of whether under way, anchored or moored. This category does not include striking underwater wrecks.

5 Contact Includes ships lost as a result of striking an external substance but *not* another ship or the sea bottom (see categories 4 & 6). This category includes striking drilling rigs/platforms, regardless of whether in fixed position or in tow.

6 Wrecked/Stranded Includes ships lost as a result of touching the sea bottom, sandbanks or seashore, etc., as well as entangled on underwater wrecks.

7 War Loss—Damage During Hostilities This category is intended to encompass loss occasioned to ships by hostile acts.

8 Hull/Machinery Damage Includes ships lost as a result of hull/machinery damage or failure which is not attributable to categories 1–7 or category 9.

9 Miscellaneous Includes ships which have been lost which, for want of sufficient reasons, cannot be classified.

The last three categories are included together under the heading 'Lost' in Table 1.

DATE OF CASUALTY The date of casualty is that on which the first reported event of the casualty occurred.

Definitions

TOTAL LOSS For the purpose of Lloyd's Register Casualty Returns the term 'Total Loss' refers to a merchant ship which, as a result of being a marine casualty, has ceased to exist, either by virtue of the fact that the ship is irrecoverable or has subsequently been broken up. Ships which have been declared constructive total losses but which are undergoing or have undergone repairs during the quarter are not included in the Return.

CASUALTY CATEGORIES are defined as follows:

1 Founded Includes ships which sank as a result of heavy weather, springing of leaks, breaking in two, etc., and not as a consequence of categories 2–7.

2 Missing After a reasonable period of time, no news having been received of a ship and its fate being therefore undetermined, the

Notes for the Current Quarter

CASUALTIES

The percentage proportion of the world fleet totally lost during the September Quarter, 1982, was 0.10% of ships and 0.09% of tonnage (see Table 1).

Among the total losses reported this quarter:

The oldest ship was the fishing vessel VINDENES (NOR) 194 GT, built 1933 which was burnt out off Kragero (see page 66).

The largest ship was the ore/oil carrier IRON TRANSPORTER (CHT) 69 786 GT, built 1971, which was broken up following stranding (see page 67).

The highest loss of life occurred in the general dry cargo ship ANDEN (PER) 4 467 GT, built 1961. Four of the crew were reported killed and twelve were reported missing after she was wrecked during a hurricane (see page 67).

There were fifteen total losses in the Fire/Explosion category, four of which were tankers and in each of these cases the incident started in the engine room/accommodation areas.

Serious casualties were reported to the following ships over 10 000 GT during the quarter, which are not included in this Return (see definition of Total Loss).

ADELFA (PAN) 11 536 GT, built 1966. Damaged by fire 23 September, reported repaired.

AL TAJDAR (LIB) 17 747 GT, built 1965. Damaged by fire 25 August, reported awaiting repairs.

ALGOL (T) (GB) 33 329 GT, built 1977. Damaged by fire 10 reported repaired.

ATLANTIC SUPERIOR (CAN) 24 638 GT, built 1982. Damaged stranding 29 September, reported repaired.

EXXON NEW ORLEANS (T) (USA) 32 035 GT, built 1965. Damaged by explosion 12 August, reported repaired.

WORLD COSMOS (T) (PAN) 24 655 GT, Built 1982. Damaged stranding 9 August, reported repaired.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

The proportion of the fleet broken up, etc., not consequent casualty was 0.28% of ships and 0.94% of tonnage (see Table 1).

The volume of tonnage broken up, etc., this quarter was 2 356 474 GT higher than for the same period in 1981 and 74 011 GT higher than the record gross tonnage of 3 909 GT June Quarter, 1982. Disposals from Liberia, Panama and Greece accounted for almost sixty per cent of the total tonnage.

Thirteen tankers with gross tonnage over 100 000 were broken up during the quarter; they were all steamships and all built between 1968 and 1974 (inclusive).

Almost fifty-two per cent of the tonnage was broken up in the Province of Taiwan and over twenty-nine per cent in Korea.

The largest ship reported broken up this quarter was the tanker REGINA MAERSK (DEN) 143 686 GT, built 1971 (see page 77).

The oldest ship reported broken up this quarter was the tanker SOUSS (MOR) 206 GT, built 1924 (see page 77).

Casualty Information System

All data in this Casualty Return is produced from the Casualty Information System maintained on the Society's IBM 3033N mainframe computer. Further details of the Casualty Information System and other shipping information files may be found on the inside back cover of this Return.

Definitions

TOTAL LOSS For the purpose of Lloyd's Register Casualty Returns the term 'Total Loss' refers to a merchant ship which, as a result of being a marine casualty, has ceased to exist, either by virtue of the fact that the ship is irrecoverable or has subsequently been broken up. Ships which have been declared constructive total losses but which are undergoing or have undergone repairs during the quarter are not included in the Return.

CASUALTY CATEGORIES are defined as follows:

1 Founded Includes ships which sank as a result of heavy weather, springing of leaks, breaking in two, etc., and not as a consequence of categories 2-7.

2 Missing After a reasonable period of time, no news having been received of a ship and its fate being therefore undetermined, the ship is posted as 'Missing' at the Corporation of Lloyd's and is

included in the Missing category on the data base together with similar cases reported by other reliable sources.

Note: In peacetime, missing ships are considered as losses occasioned to ships by marine perils.

3 Fire/Explosion Includes ships lost as a result of fire and/or explosion where it is the first event reported.

Note: It therefore follows that casualties involving fires and explosions after collisions, stranding, etc., would be categorized under 'Collision', 'Stranding'.

4 Collision Includes ships lost as a result of striking or being struck by another ship, regardless of whether under way, anchored or moored. This category does not include striking underwater wrecks.

5 Contact Includes ships lost as a result of striking an external substance but *not* another ship or the sea bottom (see categories 4 & 6). This category includes striking drilling rigs/platforms, regardless of whether in fixed position or in tow.

6 Wrecked/Stranded Includes ships lost as a result of touching the sea bottom, sandbanks or seashore, etc., as well as entanglement on underwater wrecks.

7 War Loss—Damage During Hostilities This category is intended to encompass loss occasioned to ships by hostile acts.

8 Hull/Machinery Damage Includes ships lost as a result of machinery damage or failure which is not attributable to categories 1-7 or category 9.

9 Miscellaneous Includes ships which have been lost which, for want of sufficient reasons, cannot be classified.

The last three categories are included together under the heading 'Lost' in Table 1.

DATE OF CASUALTY The date of casualty is that on which the first reported event of the casualty occurred.

Notes for the Current Quarter

CASUALTIES

The percentage proportion of the world fleet totally lost during the December Quarter, 1982, was 0.13% of ships and 0.09% of tonnage (see Table 1).

Among the total losses reported this quarter:

The oldest ship was the general dry cargo ship SINE S (GBI) 113 GT, built 1913, which foundered off Mengabu Island (see page 89).

The largest ship was the tanker UNIREA (RUM) 88 285 GT, built 1979, which was extensively damaged by explosions and fire off Cape Kaliakra (see page 91).

The highest loss of life occurred in the trawler SHUN TIEN No. 1 (CHT) 150 GT. Three people died and four were reported missing after she capsized and sank (see page 89).

There were sixteen total losses in the Fire/Explosion category, two of which were tankers and in both of these cases the incident started in the cargo tanks.

Serious casualties were reported to the following ships over 10 000 GT during the quarter, which are not included in this Return (see definition of Total Loss):

CHIOS MERCHANT (GRC) 11 587 GT, built 1961. Sustained hull damage 5 October, future unknown.

HARALABOS (T/LIB) 45 267 GT, built 1966. Damaged by fire and explosion 26 November, future unknown.

ITAPUCA (BRZ) 10 845 GT, built 1971. Damaged by fire 19 October, reported laid up.

JOHN A (PAN) 10 016 GT, built 1968. Damaged by explosion and fire 3 October, future unknown.

PURHA (T) (FIN) 18 225 GT, built 1968. Damaged by fire 23 December, reported repaired.

RAFFAELLO (IRN) 45 933 GT, built 1965. Damaged during hostilities 20 November, future unknown.

SHIRVAN (T) (IRN) 41 440 GT, built 1979. Damaged during hostilities 20 November, reported repaired.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

The proportion of the fleet broken up, etc., not consequent to casualty was 0.26% of ships and 0.64% of tonnage (see Table 1).

The volume of tonnage broken up, etc., this quarter was over one million less than the highest ever quarterly figure (reported in the September Quarter, 1982). It was, nevertheless, 1 289 100 GT higher than for the same period in 1981, and thereby, together with March, June and September's figures, assures a record for 1982. Final figures will be published in the Annual Return this year.

Forty-nine tankers with a total gross tonnage of 1 780 197 GT reported broken up this quarter representing 65.6% of all tonnage disposed of.

Nearly 68% of the tonnage was broken up in the Province of Taiwan, 12.1% in Pakistan, 9.3% in Korea (South), followed by 4.3% in Bangladesh (joining the ranks of the top breakers for the first time).

The largest ship reported broken up this quarter was the tugs ARION (GRC) 131 327 GT, built 1971 (see page 95).

The oldest ship reported broken up this quarter was the tug CHIRONE (ITL) 184 GT, built 1913 (see page 96).

Casualty Information System

All data in this Casualty Return is produced from the Casualty Information System maintained on the Society's IBM 3033N mainframe computer. Further details of the Casualty Information System and other shipping information files may be found on the inside back cover of this Return.

Definitions

TOTAL LOSS For the purpose of Lloyd's Register Casualty Returns the term 'Total Loss' refers to a merchant ship which, as a result of being a marine casualty, has ceased to exist, either by virtue of the fact that the ship is irrecoverable or has subsequently been broken up. Ships which have been declared constructive total losses but which are undergoing or have undergone repairs during the quarter are not included in the Return.

CASUALTY CATEGORIES are defined as follows:

1 Founded Includes ships which sank as a result of heavy weather, springing of leaks, breaking in two, etc., and not as a consequence of categories 2-7.

2 Missing After a reasonable period of time, no news having been received of a ship and its fate being therefore undetermined, the ship is posted as 'Missing' at the Corporation of Lloyd's and is

included in the Missing category on the data base together with similar cases reported by other reliable sources.

Note: In peacetime, missing ships are considered as losses occasioned to ships by marine perils.

3 Fire/Explosion Includes ships lost as a result of fire and/or explosion where it is the first event reported.

Note: It therefore follows that casualties involving fires and explosions after collisions, stranding, etc., would be categorized under 'Collision', 'Stranding'.

4 Collision Includes ships lost as a result of striking or being struck by another ship, regardless of whether under way, anchored or moored. This category does not include striking underwater wrecks.

5 Contact Includes ships lost as a result of striking an external substance but not another ship or the sea bottom (see categories 4 & 6). This category includes striking drilling rigs/platforms regardless of whether in fixed position or in tow.

6 Wrecked/Stranded Includes ships lost as a result of touching sea bottom, sandbanks or seashore, etc., as well as entanglement on underwater wrecks.

7 War Loss—Damage During Hostilities This category is used to encompass loss occasioned to ships by hostile acts.

8 Hull/Machinery Damage Includes ships lost as a result of machinery damage or failure which is not attributable to categories 1-7 or category 9.

9 Miscellaneous Includes ships which have been lost without sufficient reasons, cannot be classified.

The last three categories are included together under the heading 'Lost' in Table 1.

DATE OF CASUALTY The date of casualty is that on which the first reported event of the casualty occurred.

Summary of Total losses during 1982

The total tonnage lost by the world fleet during 1982 (1,631,930 gross tonnage) increased by 393,680 gross tonnage compared with 1981 and is the second lowest figure since 1977. The number of ships (402) is forty-three more than last year. Tonnage lost in three categories showed an increase compared with figures recorded for the previous year. Comparisons over a period of ten years are shown at the end of Table 1.

The largest ship totally lost during the year was the Liberian steam tanker HERCULES (99,827 gross tonnage).

Foundered The number of ships that foundered during 1982 (142) was twenty-two more than the previous year. Over thirty-nine per cent of these were twenty years old or more. The tonnage lost in this category decreased by 20,363 to a figure of 223,459 gross tonnage.

The two largest ships lost were the Panamanian tanker GOGO RUNNER (13,136 gross tonnage, built 1958) carrying vegetable oil and the Greek specialised tanker VICTORY (12,487 gross tonnage, built 1960) carrying molasses.

Also in this category was the oldest ship totally lost this year, the tug WHITEMAN 9 (198 gross tonnage, built 1904) registered in the United States of America.

Missing Tonnage lost in this category totalled 19,950 gross tonnage, mostly accounted for by the Panamanian ore carrier ORIENT TREASURY (19,505 gross tonnage, built 1966) carrying chrome ore.

Fire/Explosion Gross tonnage totally lost in this category during 1982 was 570,126 which was an increase of 100,904 gross tonnage over 1981. Seventy-nine ships were lost during the year (twelve more than the previous year) twenty-eight of which were in port.

Five tankers with a gross tonnage over 20,000 were lost in this category, the largest being the Romanian tanker UNIREA (88,285 gross tonnage, built 1979).

Collision Gross tonnage lost through collision decreased to 46,543 which is less than half the previous year's figure. Thirty-two ships were lost during the year, nine less than in 1981. At least ten of the collisions occurred in bad visibility or fog.

The largest ship lost was the Liberian general dry cargo ship AFRICAN PIONEER (9,161 gross tonnage, built 1971).

Contact Six ships were lost in this category during the year, amounting to 7,961 gross tonnage. The largest was the general dry cargo ship CORBANK (2,334 gross tonnage, Cyprus flag, built 1956).

Wrecked/Stranded Total losses in this category increased by 159,901 to a gross tonnage figure of 391,930 (108 ships).

The largest ship lost was the ore/oil carrier IRON TRANSPORTER (69,786 gross tonnage, built 1971) registered in the Province of Taiwan, which stranded after dragging anchors during a typhoon.

Lost, etc. Total losses in this category increased from 1,125,948 gross tonnage in 1981 to 32 ships of 371,961 gross tonnage. The greater part of this (17 ships of 235,940 gross tonnage) was lost during hostilities. The largest ship lost during the year in this category, the Liberian tanker HERCULES (99,827 gross tonnage, built 1971) bombed during the South Atlantic War, contributing to the largest figure for tonnage lost due to war since 1945.

Distribution The geographical distribution of the total losses during the year is shown in map form on pages 121-125.


Types The total number of 402 ships lost during 1982 included 171 oil tankers, gross tonnage 608,675 (37·3 per cent), 171 general carriers, gross tonnage 287,732 (17·6 per cent) and 96 other craft. Two hundred and fourteen general cargo ships were lost.

Size Forty-three per cent of the ships lost were under 500 gross tonnage. The number of ships with a gross tonnage of over 500 lost was thirty-five, of which five ships were over 50,000 gross tonnage.

Age Six per cent of all ships lost were less than five years old, twenty-six per cent were over twenty-five years of age.

Lives lost The number of persons reported killed or missing as a result of total losses are indicated below for the years 1978-1982. The figure for 1982 shows a decrease of 542 from last year's figure. One hundred and thirteen of the 673 lives reported in 1982 can be attributed to the various conflicts around the world. Of these, fifty-eight were in the South Atlantic (SIR GALAHAD, forty-eight), thirty in the Iran-Iraq war and twenty-five off Lebanon. In 1981 there were only two lives reported lost due to hostilities.

High figures for human casualties were again reported from Indonesia and the Philippines; the greatest number (55) being when the Indonesian general dry cargo ship KARYA TAMAN (142 gross tonnage, built 1975) founded in the Java Sea in heavy weather. Forty-nine were reported killed or missing on the Philippine ferry QUEEN HELEN (497 gross tonnage, date build unknown) suffered damage by fire and explosion in the South China Sea and forty-seven when the Indonesian general dry cargo ship PULAU SATONDA (310 gross tonnage, built 1950) was missing on a voyage between Surabaya and Samarinda.



Registration Panama, Greece and Japan suffered the highest number of ships lost, with 70, 49 and 42 respectively. Greece suffered the highest gross tonnage loss with 352,822.

Percentage losses by registration are shown in Table 1; a comparison over a period of years can be obtained from Table 2.

Summary of ships Broken up, etc. during 1982

Tonnage broken up during 1982 increased by 6,372,375 to a
tonnage figure of 13,624,422. This is the highest total ever
recorded, being 3,554,321 gross tonnage more than the previous
figure of 10,070,101 recorded in 1978. The number of
ships involved (1,113) is 351 more than in 1981 and is the highest
ever recorded (1,078 in 1978).


Largest ships broken up during the year were the Danish tanker
REGINA MAERSK (143,686 gross tonnage, built 1971) and the
Hong Kong tanker WORLD CAVALIER (138,025 gross tonnage,
1974), the youngest tanker broken up in 1982.

Oldest ship broken up in 1982 was the Norwegian general dry
cargo ship HAFRSFJORD (180 gross tonnage, built 1901).

Counties sending most tonnage to the breakers were Liberia
(699,207 gross tonnage), Greece (2,142,926 gross tonnage),
TAMBAWA (1,852,874 gross tonnage), United Kingdom (834,102
gross tonnage) and Japan (829,209 gross tonnage).

Province of Taiwan took over fifty-seven per cent of all
tonnage broken up during the year, followed by Korea (South) with
nearly twenty per cent and Pakistan with nearly twelve per cent,
as can be seen from the chart below.


Principal places of Disposal

Tanker tonnage disposed of (9,871,269 gross tonnage) amounted
to over 72 per cent of the total sold for demolition. The average size
of tanker broken up was 35,381 gross tonnage. Forty tankers of
over 100,000 gross tonnage were broken up during the year: all
but one were steamships and over 92 per cent were ten or more
years of age. A comparison between tankers and bulk carriers
broken up over a period of five years can be seen below.

Four hundred and ninety-one general cargo ships were broken up,
an increase of 169 compared with 1981. Seventy-three per cent
were twenty years old or more.

Ships which have been declared constructive total losses but which are undergoing or have undergone repairs during the quarter are not included in the Return.
 - 2 CASUALTY CATEGORIES** are defined as follows:
 - 1 Founded** Includes ships which sank as a result of heavy weather, springing of leaks, breaking in two, etc., and not as a consequence of categories 2-7.
 - 2 Missing** After a reasonable period of time, no news having been received of a ship and its fate being therefore


